## **UNCLAIMED FUNDS LIST TO APPEAR IN TUESDAY'S CLEVELAND PLAIN DEALER**

### **Division Wants to Reunite You with Your Forgotten Money**

Ohio Department of Commerce Director Andre T. Porter urges Cuyahoga County residents to join in the 2013 Unclaimed Funds Treasure Hunt by checking the *Cleveland Plain Dealer* on Tuesday, May 21. By checking the newspaper advertisement, readers can find out if they are entitled to unclaimed funds turned over to the Ohio Division of Unclaimed Funds in the past year.

Unclaimed funds are money or the rights to money that have been dormant or forgotten. Some common examples include: dormant checking and savings accounts, forgotten rent and utility deposits, uncashed checks, undelivered stock certificates, and uncashed insurance policies.

“There could be money sitting here with your name on it. Check the Cuyahoga County list to see if you, your family or your friends have unclaimed funds,” said Director Porter. “This money can help Ohioans buy a tank of gas, pay off some bills, make a needed home repair or take a vacation.”

In Fiscal Year 2012, the Division paid 58,953 claims worth approximately \$61.1 million. The average claim was for \$1,037.

The Cuyahoga County advertisement will include 32,620 unclaimed funds accounts worth \$22,233,953.80. The advertised accounts, each valued at \$50 or more, were turned over to the Division within the past year for individuals whose last known address was in Cuyahoga County. The advertised names will appear in alphabetical order by the owner's last known city and then in alphabetical order by the owner's last name. A list of unclaimed funds accounts is available on the Department of Commerce's Online Treasure Hunt website at [www.unclaimedfundstreasurehunt.ohio.gov](http://www.unclaimedfundstreasurehunt.ohio.gov) along with forms for individuals and organizations to use in claiming their money.
