Arizona Man Pleads Guilty to Fraud

Following a criminal referral by the Ohio Department of Commerce - Division of Securities and an indictment, Christopher Hodge of Phoenix, Arizona, pled guilty today in the Logan County Court of Common Pleas to telecommunications fraud, a felony of the third degree. Hodge faces a maximum of 36 months in prison.

The plea stems from Hodge's sale of interest in a company called Intellicore Solutions. The indictment alleged that through this business, the defendant solicited \$40,000 from an Ohio resident for an investment interest in Intellicore Solutions. Instead of using the money for investment purposes, the indictment alleged that the money was used for personal expenses.

The sentencing hearing is scheduled for May 30, 2017.

Logan County Prosecutor Eric C. Stewart is prosecuting this case.
